Sawing and Piercing Class Held on Sat, June 17th By Carole Jean Wright

Wow! Amazing Metalworking Class! Everyone helping each other as we learned some new skills and practiced others.

Twelve of us spent about six hours in a fun day of cutting sheet metal. Once cut and flattened,



and sawed with tiny saws

blades. It was fun to see everyone start with a paper pattern and finish with a beautiful design cut into metal. Some will be earrings or

pendants and others will be components to be soldered to another piece of metal, possibly with stones in bezels in our Silversmithing Class. Linda Marlin went home and made a suncatcher from one of her pieces. Watch for more examples of our work to show up at the next meeting show and tell.





There were a lot of metalsmithing skills in practice on Saturday. Cutting, piercing, sawing, filing, sanding, polishing, handling saw frames and saw blades and general metalworking skills.
